गुरु साक्षात् परब्रह्मा, तस्मै श्री गुरुवे नमः ॥

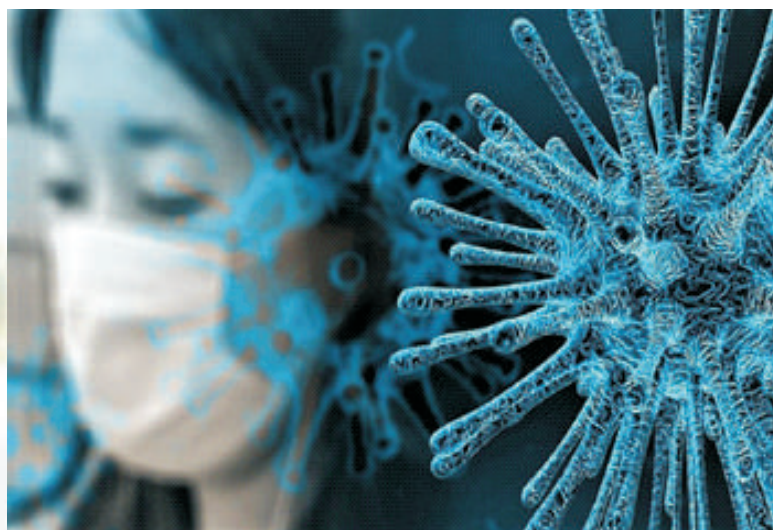
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THE CORONA PANDEMIC

Even though in December 2019 there was news of a newfound virus outbreak in China, no one was prepared for it to take on the form of a Pandemic. The Pandemic is described as a worldwide-spread of a disease. By January 2020, this virus had travelled far and wide and was announced as a Public Health Emergency by the WHO. It was named as COVID 19 - **Corona Virus Disease 2019** in February 2020 and by March 2020, it was declared as a Pandemic too!

With such fast spreading nature of the virus, most of the countries realised - as the adage goes- prevention is better than cure. Beginning with wide-spread awareness campaigns, the countries even had to reach a stage of complete lockdown to arrest the spread of this virus. The people who have the virus are being identified and sent to isolation. So far, the studies show that the virus spreads through droplets and the symptoms start to show within 14 days. Droplet-spread means that wet particles containing the virus get exchanged through touch or air. The droplets present in the cough or sneeze of an affected person can spread the virus quite quickly. This is why it is important to cover our mouth with our elbows when we cough or sneeze and maintain social distancing at all times.

Some other precautions we can take to prevent the spread of the virus are: Wear mask, sanitise your surroundings, wash your hands frequently, do not touch any surface unnecessarily, avoid touching your face especially eyes, nose and mouth and avoid

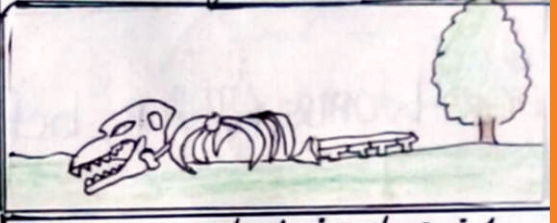

Once upon a time, there were four Brahmin friends who had grown up together in a village. One day they all decided to go to town to try their luck. All four of them set out for town through a forest.

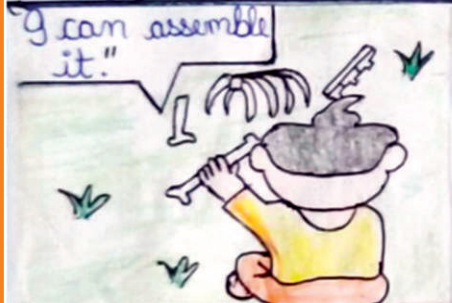
On the way, they saw a skeleton of an animal.

Now my turn, just watch how I cover the skeleton with skin!"



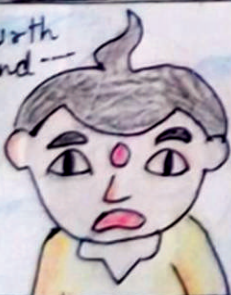
